# Health Science and Criminal Justice, BS (Boston)

The combined major in health science and criminal justice offers students an opportunity to integrate the study of healthcare with relevant topics from criminal justice. Students complete core courses in health sciences and criminal justice and electives focusing on the issues pertinent to factors impacting crime and health, healthcare, and the criminal justice system. The degree is designed to prepare students for a range of careers, including roles in health services management, policy analyses, policy development, as well as serving as the foundation for future careers.
