

German, Minor

The German minor focuses on two outcomes: developing students' linguistic proficiency and broadening their insights into germanophone cultures so that students may engage in meaningful interactions with German speakers throughout the world. The communication skills and transcultural awareness that students acquire throughout the course of the minor provide preparation for a wide range of opportunities and experiences, both in and beyond the classroom.

Minor Requirements

Complete all courses as outlined below unless otherwise indicated. A total of **five courses** is required. A maximum of two transfer courses, including transferable courses taken abroad, may count toward the five courses required for the minor. Study-abroad courses must be approved by the German academic coordinator prior to the semester abroad.
