Italian, Minor

The Italian minor focuses on two outcomes: developing students' linguistic proficiency and broadening their insights into Italian culture so that students may engage in meaningful interactions with Italian speakers throughout the world. The communication skills and transcultural awareness that students acquire throughout the course of the minor are designed to provide preparation for a wide range of opportunities and experiences, both in and beyond the classroom.

Study-abroad courses must be approved by the Italian academic coordinator prior to the semester abroad.
